

JOB DESCRIPTION: MYP Math and Math Intervention Teacher

Reports to: Principal

The position requires the planning, organising and implementation of an appropriate MYP Mathematics instructional program in a secondary learning environment that guides, supports and encourages students to develop and fulfil their academic potential in Math. Additionally, provide mathematics intervention support to students in coordination with the Learning Support team and the Math Head of Department. Work is performed under the supervision of the principal.

Mathematics Duties and Responsibilities include but are not limited to the following:

- Plan, prepare and deliver lesson plans and instructional materials in MYP Mathematics that facilitate active learning.
- Develop schemes of work, lesson plans and tests that are in accordance with established procedures and align with established standards.
- Establish and communicate clear objectives for all learning activities.
- Instruct and monitor students in the use of learning materials and equipment.
- Prepare the classroom for class activities.
- Utilise a variety of learning materials and resources for use in educational activities
- Assign and evaluate class work, homework, tests and assignments and provide appropriate feedback on student work.
- Encourage and monitor the progress of individual students and use information to adjust teaching strategies.
- Update all necessary records accurately and completely, including information on student attendance and student progress and attainment in the courses taught, as required by laws, school policies and regulations.
- Use relevant technology to support and differentiate instruction.
- Manage student behaviour in the classroom by creating a welcoming and inclusive environment, establishing expectations, and enforcing rules and procedures.
- Prepare required reports on students and activities.
- Participate in department, school, parent meetings and schoolwide /division events and activities.
- Participate, monitor, support and deliver ISF's division wide Wellbeing programme and any special events held within the school
- Adhere to all child protection and safeguarding guidelines

- Undergo required child protection, safeguarding, health safety and emergency response training
- Communicate necessary information regularly to students, colleagues and parents regarding student progress and student needs.

Mathematics Support Duties and Responsibilities include but are not limited to the following:

- Plan, deliver, evaluate and implement curriculum including schemes of work and deployment of resources, which can include direct in-person student instruction and/or support for small groups of students engaging in online maths programs.
- Liaise with all relevant staff to ensure students are supported.
- Attend and contribute to curriculum departmental meetings providing subject specific strategies.
- Contribute to the process for placement and exiting of students in ISF courses and interventions who require mathematics support.
- With the Mathematics/Learning Support team, assess and monitor students' progress toward established standards
- In coordination with Learning Support, use data appropriately to set targets and expectations and to ensure effective differentiated instruction for students.
- For students with Individual Learning Plans, implement recommended accommodations and access arrangements in coordination with Learning Support staff.

Other functions of the job include but are not limited to the following:

- Demonstrate preparation and skill in working with students from diverse cultural, linguistic, economic and ability backgrounds.
- Use relevant technology to support and differentiate instruction
- Abide with all policies and processes of the school
- Cooperate with the Head of School, Principals, Heads of Department, Curriculum Coordinators and other teachers in the preparation and development of courses of study, teaching materials, teaching programmes, methods of teaching, and assessment and wellbeing care arrangements
- Ensure high standards of professional practice and quality of teaching and communicating, consulting, collaborating and cooperating with other members of the school staff
- Communicate effectively parents and staff on student progress
- Participate in appropriate professional activities.
- Other duties as assigned.
